Harold gained an Urban and Regional Planning degree from Ryerson University, and a Master of Architecture from the University of British Columbia in Vancouver. Harold has received several academic awards in recognition of research and design excellence. Upon gaining his Master of Architecture, Harold was awarded the school's highest academic prize for his thesis – "Surmounting Density- Accumulating Urban" - which established an innovative approach and design vocabulary for urban intensification and revitalization.
